Advisors and course registration

Graduate students must communicate with their academic advisors before registering for courses. This communication must take place each semester.

Submission of transcripts

New graduate students must make sure their final transcripts, showing completion of their prior degree, have been sent to the Office of University Admissions.

Responsible Conduct of Research (RCR) course

INTD 799, the 0-credit RCR course, must be taken by all PhD students in their first year of studies. Master's students registering for the first time in Master's Thesis (commonly a 701B or 701C course) or Master's Project (commonly a 700B course) must take simultaneously this RCR course. Students learn in this online course how to maintain high standards in professional integrity and ethics while working on research projects. The course focuses on such topics as conflict of interest, research and ethics, plagiarism, reproducibility of results, research misconduct, authorship, and data management. To receive the satisfactory (S) grade, a student must be awarded the course completion certificate.

NJIT has five colleges for prospective graduate students. Each one is home to a wide variety of graduate programs. Whatever educational goal you wish to achieve, NJIT will help you reach it.

Newark College of Engineering (NCE)

The Newark College of Engineering (NCE) was established in 1919 as an outgrowth of the Newark Technical School which was founded in the 1880s. Today NCE offers 18 undergraduate and 21 Master of Science degrees, as well as 9 tracks toward a doctoral (Ph.D.) degree. Undergraduate enrollment is and approximately 4.200. graduate enrollment is approximately 1,350. 148 faculty members engage in instruction, student mentoring, professional activities, scholarship, research, and development of public policy in the areas of engineering and technology. NCE has several widely-recognized strengths, including expertise in infrastructure (water, transportation, telecommunications, computer networking); multiple projects on manufacturing, control, navigation and robotics; and fastgrowing work in bio-medical engineering, at the interface of engineering, computing and the life sciences.
