






## **Campus Transformation and Community**



The 2018 economic impact analysis is based on the work of Econsult Solutions, Inc. which completed a comprehensive analysis of NJIT's economic impact on the State of New Jersey and City of Newark in 2015. This revised version specifies "impact categories" utilizing updated information and in some cases refined modeling approaches. Here is a brief explanation of the major categories:

Annual Operations Includes NJIT annual operating expenditures – employment, procurement, education and research activity. This yields a total annual economic impact of \$753 million within New Jersey, supporting 4,150 jobs with \$295 million in earnings.

Capital Investments The university's commitment to add new spaces as well as renovate existing facilities yields an annual impact of \$148 million within New Jersey, supporting 890 jobs with \$46 million in earnings.

New Jersey Innovation Institute (NJII)
Operations The growth in size and prominence of
NJII warranted that it be depicted as its own distinct
economic impact category. NJII generates \$114 million
in economic output within New Jersey, supporting 680
jobs with \$39 million in earnings.

Industry and Regional Partnerships The university's emphasis on assisting startup companies, healthcare initiatives, and advanced manufacturing yields

an economic impact of \$423 million within New Jersey, supporting 2,930 jobs with \$161 million in earnings.

**Student and Visitor Spending** The enrollment of over 11,400 students and 117,000 visitors to campus annually yields an annual impact of \$169 million within New Jersey, supporting 1,460 jobs with \$41 million in earnings.

Wage Premiums Quantifies the impact from additional household earnings and spending circulating in New Jersey and the local economy due to NJIT's role in training and credentialing the state's workforce. This yields a total annual impact of \$392 million, supporting 2,240 jobs with \$120 million in earnings.

**City of Newark** The economic activity attributable to NJIT within the City of Newark generates \$853 million in economic output, supporting 5,000 jobs with \$327 million in earnings.
